TREEDC has partnered with the Tennessee Energy, Industry and Construction Consortium (TEICC) to hold a statewide essay writing contest for middle school students in Putnam, Gibson, Overton, White, and Roane counties during Careers in Energy Week from February 10 – 14th, 2014. The theme will be Renewable Energy and Careers for the Future. The students will be asked to write an essay describing how energy workers can make a world of difference. The students will also describe the energy sectors that hire those positions.

TREEDC Holds Strategic Planning Retreat

On October 17-18, 2013, TREEDC held a 2014 goal setting session with Founding Members Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, the University of Tennessee, Tennessee Tech University and the Tennessee Gas Association. MTAS Management Consultant Margaret Norris was the facilitator and did a wonderful job in developing encompassing goals and strategies for 2014. The participants reviewed TREEDC's 2013 goals and plotted a path for 2014 starting with the development of the Inaugural Annual International Renewable Energy Conference with Tennessee Tech on October 12-14th in Cookeville. Franklin Sustainability Coordinator Andrew Orr and Tennessee Tech University Interim Director of External Relations Dr. Dennis Tennant will be coordinating the logistics of this conference.

The Retreat also involved discussions of setting up a tax exempt bond fund for energy projects and to complete one funding project in 2014. TREEDC also plans to restructure its Outreach Programming by conducting elementary school forums, enhancing its International Exchange Program and organizing annual conference in Tennessee and the Philippines.

TREEDC Partners with Pew Charitable Trusts at Kingsport Forum

The Tennessee Renewable Energy & Economic Development Council (TREEDC) held its first educational luncheon forum at the Kingsport Higher Education Center on October 29, 2013. TREEDC partnered with Founding Member Pew Charitable Trusts and the City of Kingsport to showcase area renewable energy initiatives to area stakeholders. Representatives from the University of Tennessee Center for Industrial Services, Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA), Eastman, Erwin, Johnson City, Bristol Congressman Phil Roe's staff and area local officials attended the first TREEDC- Tri-Cities forum. Emily Bryan, Martin Penny and MTAS Management Consultant/TREEDC Director Warren Nevad crafted the agenda.

Max Shilstone, Director of Business Development for TREEDC Gold member Clean Line Energy Partners provided a video to describe the Plains & Eastern Clean Line Project which will connect Tennessee to superb wind resources of Great Plains with a High Voltage Direct Current (HVDC) transmission line. This HVDC line focuses on connecting renewable resources to load centers. The transmission line uses narrower right-of-ways than equivalent Alternating Current and has lower line losses. This line which begins in Guymon, Oklahoma and ends in Tipton County, Tennessee will bring hundreds of direct jobs during construction. The \$300 million investment in transmission facilities in western Tennessee will provide significant tax revenues to Tennessee. He concluded his remarks by expressing his appreciation to TREEDC and TVA for helping him engage with community officials, business leaders, landowners, and other stakeholders in the project area.

TREEDC Director Appointed to Knoxville Sustainability Advisory Board

TREEDC Director Warren Nevad was recently appointed to the Knoxville Sustainability Advisory Board. The work of the board includes reviewing the 2011Energy & Sustainability Work Plan, which was developed with extensive community and stakeholder input. It outlined 35 strategic action items through which the City would improve the sustainability of municipal operations and the larger Knoxville community. Many of those actions are complete or firmly underway. This 2013 Energy & Sustainability Work Plan Update summarizes the progress made on these actions and provides more detail about the impacts of the City's sustainability efforts. It identifies next steps for action items currently in progress and also adds several new action items that leverage new opportunities and priorities. Although it structured to reflect the six original work plan categories, several action items have been re-categorized. There is also a new "Urban Agriculture & Landscape" section that highlights Mayor Madeline Rogero's administrative focus on urban food and landscapes. Designed as both a retrospective report card and a forward-looking planning document, this Update, alongside the details provided in the original Work Plan, will guide the Office of Sustainability for years to come.

TREEDC Member City Memphis Announces Clean & Green Initiative



Memphis Mayor A C Wharton recently unveiled the <u>Clean & Green Initiative</u>. Led by TREEDC Member Memphis Bioworks, the initiative is a five-year sustainability strategy for the City of Memphis that will create local jobs, reduce the City's operating costs and improve the environment.

As part of the initiative, Bioworks is embarking on one of the largest municipal solar projects in the nation. Memphis Civic Solar is a leading-edge project for the City of Memphis that will install 1.5 Megawatts of solar energy systems -- or 6,000 solar panels -- across 30 different municipal buildings (50 kilowatts each) in neighborhoods throughout Memphis while putting local Memphians to work.

When completed, Memphis Civic Solar will position Memphis as a national leader in sustainability and will create positive and measurable environmental, economic and social benefits for the citizens of Memphis. For more information go to https://ioby.org/project/memphis-civic-solar.

TREEDC /Founding Member Vis Solis Assists with Philippine Typhoon Recovery

During December 2013, 80 emergency power kits for the Typhoon Yolanda effected areas, each containing solar charging/lighting units with a portable radio, were delivered by the Tennessee Renewable Energy & Economic Council (TREEDC), Vis Solis and the Renewable Energy Association of the Philippines (REAP) to Department of Energy (DOE) Assistant Secretary Raymund Acol. The power kits can now aid in the recovery efforts in the typhoon affected areas, and subsequently provide some off-grid households with a sustainable renewable energy resource after recovery. TREEDC

International Consultant Douglas Jackson added that TREEDC member University of the Philippines-Visayas campus in Tacloban would receive some of these units, and that others may be sent to the Eastern Samar province area, as power on Leyte Island is expected to be restored much sooner than on Samar.

These power kits were funded by Vis Solis, a Tennessee renewable energy based company that is developing world class solar electric systems in Tennessee and the Philippines. Vis Solis is a Platinum Founding Member of TREEDC and is assisting with TREEDC's International exchange Program in the Philippines with REAP which links educational awareness and social responsibility programs among Philippine and Tennessee cities, universities and businesses. TREEDC also expressed its appreciation to REAP President Oly Serafica and Assistant Secretary Agol.
