TREEDC MEMBER CITY OF KNOXVILLE WINS STATEWIDE SUSTAINABILITY AWARD

On June 24, 2014, the Tennessee Municipal League (TML) awarded Knoxville an Excellence in Green Leadership Award at their annual conference in Chattanooga, Tennessee. Knoxville Sustainability Director Erin Burns accepted this prestigious award given by TML, a voluntary, cooperative organization established by the cities and towns of the state for mutual assistance and improvement. TML's primary function is to work with the Tennessee General Assembly on behalf of city governments, promoting legislation helpful to cities, and opposing legislation harmful to cities. Knoxville's notable accomplishments in 2013 include:

Updating Knoxville's Energy & Sustainability Work Plan & Emissions Inventory (online at: http://www.cityofknoxville.org/sustainability/2014workplan.pdf);

Winning an IBM Smarter Cities Challenge technical assistance grant and mobilizing a community-wide effort to improve energy efficiency services for Knoxville's lower income residents;

Partnering with the University of Tennessee to launch ZipCar, the community's first public car-sharing program;

Working with the Tennessee Renewable Energy & Economic Development Council (TREEDC) in its educational outreach activities across the state;

Hiring an Alternative Transportation Engineer, a unique position focusing on advancing transportation infrastructure for bicyclists, pedestrians, and transit users; and

Continuing to ramp-up recycling services and facilities by expanding recycling facilities at public facilities, launching recycling at City parks, and creating a new educational website on e-waste (knoxecycles.org).

In 2013, TVA awarded Knoxville a Platinum rating in the TVA Valley Sustainable Communities program. The City of Knoxville has become a national role model in pursuing green initiatives. We are very proud of TREEDC Mayor Madeline Rogero and Erin!

TREEDC RETURNS TO HIWASSEE COLLEGE

The Mayors of the Tennessee Renewable **Energy and Economic Development Council** (TREEDC) held their first 2014 Community Energy forum at Hiwassee College on April 4, 2014. TREEDC 2014 Founding members Hiwassee College, Gibson County Utility District and the University of Tennessee's Institute for Public Service sponsored this free community outreach forum for Hiwassee College students, staff and Monroe County area clean energy stakeholders. Presentations consisted of best campus practices of renewable energy and the State of Tennessee Energy initiatives. Todd Littleton, Hiwassee College Director of Alumni Affairs welcomed TREEDC and expressed his appreciation to the Mayors for organizing the 3rd annual conference at Hiwassee College.

TREEDC Chairman/ University of Tennessee President Emeritus Dr. Joe Johnson traced the origins of TREEDC as an organization that has grown initially from four (4) Tennessee rural cities in 2008 to 96 cities in Tennessee and the Philippines in 2014. Dr. Johnson advised the audience that TREEDC is now providing educational forums to elementary schools across the state. He added that TREEDC recently collaborated with the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development, Tennessee Energy. Industry and Construction Consortium (TEICC). Tennessee Tech University and the Gibson County Utility District to conduct a statewide essay contest for middle school students to build awareness for careers in renewable energy. Dr. Johnson concluded his remarks by

complimenting the TREEDC Mayors with their innovative work in the Philippines by bringing in new partners to Tennessee renewable energy stakeholders.

The University of Tennessee Public Administration Intern Trov Williamson gave a thorough PowerPoint presentation about renewable energy activities across college campuses across the United States. He mentioned that the University of Tennessee purchased 1,760 CFLs (Compact Fluorescent Lamps) to exchange for bulbs from students' desk lamps, saving \$4,190 and 60 tons of CO2 in a single semester. According to Williamson, The University of South Carolina is starting a \$19 million high-tech biomass energy plant which will annually consume an estimated 57,000 tons of tree waste and save \$2 million a year in energy costs. MTAS Management Consultant Warren Nevad also gave a PowerPoint presentation about the TREEDC International Exchange Program. The objectives of the Exchange program were to accomplish the

energy costs, vast renewable energy resources, frequent blackouts and the Renewable Energy Law of 2008. TREEDC believes that there are tremendous educational and business opportunities for our members. As of April 2014, TREEDC has 8 Philippine cities and 12 universities as members. TREEDC has conducted education forums and conferences in five (5) different colleges across the Philippines and is working with E3 integrated Solutions, ARiES Energy and Vis Solis to develop solar and waste to energy facilities in the Philippines. Philippine members will participate in the TREEDC International Renewable Energy Forum to be held at Tennessee Tech University on October 12 – 14, 2014.

Harvey Abouelata, President of ARIES Energy gave an overview of the USDA REAP Program. The USDA REAP is currently accepting applications from Rural Farmers, Ranchers, and Small Businesses for Grants Supporting Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Projects. The Program is designed to promote rural economic development by assisting rural businesses to become more energy efficient and even generate energy from their own renewable systems. Grants may range from \$2,500 to \$500,000, and the funding level this year is expected to match or exceed last year's level. ARIES Energy will prepare all the grant paperwork for organizations to apply for

Pete Westerholm, Program Manager at Office of Energy Programs (OEP), with the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation gave an update regarding recent initiatives. In December 2013, the U.S. Department of Energy awarded OEP \$426,644 for its State Energy Program 2013 Competitive Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) application.

Tennessee was just 1 of 6 states to receive funding in the FOA's Area of Interest 3 — Retrofitting Public Buildings. The project objectives are to provide education, outreach, and technical assistance to serve local governments and public housing authorities (PHAs) and to drive demand for energy efficiency investments in the State of Tennessee. The grant period of performance is February 1, 2014 to January 31, 2016. Contact Pete.Westerholm@tn.gov for more information

Max Shilstone, Business Development Director for TREEDC Diamond Member Clean Line Energy Partners described the Plains & Eastern Clean Line Project which will connect Tennessee to superb wind resources of Great Plains with a High Voltage Direct Current (HVDC) transmission line. This planned development is a \$300 million investment in transmission facilities in western Tennessee. Hundreds of direct jobs will be created during construction. Significant property tax revenue will be generated to Tipton and Shelby Counties. Shilstone urged all TREEDC members to provide support for this worthy project.

Jackson, a retired TVA official participated in the International Collaboration on Energy Technology Development and Deployment Panel. He was joined on the panel with representatives from the International Energy Agency and Meralco, the Philippines' largest distributor of electrical power. The TREEDC presentation provided a chronology of the International Exchange Program. Jackson also provided a review of the public-private approach by TREEDC to advance renewables in the Philippines through its educational outreach, social responsibility and project assistance for its Tennessee members in the Philippines.

GIBSON COUNTY UTILITY MAKES PROGRESS WITH COMPRESSED NATURAL GAS

TREEDC Gold Member Gibson County Utility District (GCUD) recently committed to a new compressed natural gas fueling facility in Trenton, Tennessee. The new CNG station will be located north of I-40 between Memphis and Nashville with gas to be supplied by Constellation, a unit of Exelon.



TREEDC Board Member/Gibson County Utility District GM Pat Riley wants to build the cleanest and greenest CNG station.

Pat Riley has been building the case for a CNG station for more than two years, says Midwest sales and marketing director Mark Watkins. GCUD designed a station that will include redundant compressors; fast-fill and ultra-fast-fill nozzles; natural gas gen-set for primary compressor power with backup from the grid; a solar array and batteries to supply low-voltage power plus area and canopy LED lighting, each with tertiary power supply from the grid. The Trenton-based Gibson County Utility District distributes natural gas to customers in Tennessee's Gibson, Obion and Dyer Counties.
